
Community Café – March 21st

The Pastor's Letter

Psalm 42:2

My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?

Lent in Latin is *Quadragesima* meaning *'Fortieth.'* During these forty days we have an opportunity to open up ourselves to our Lord in a deeper sense. It is a time for renewal. Renewal of our minds, hearts, and soul. Some people take this time to fast and in prayers. Others spend it with Lenten devotion and reflection. All of these are ways where we can all be renewed. One may ask, "Why only do these during Lent?"Lent is described traditionally as lasting for forty days, it is to commemorate Jesus fasting in the desert for forty days in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and

Luke. Jesus proved that the power of the Word of God is our defense in facing temptations of this world. Temptations are never easy to deal with. It is alway enticing, alluring and so appealing. But no matter how irresistible temptations are - we are reminded to rely on the Word of God just like what Jesus did in the wilderness. Matthew 4: 1-11, He did not turn the stone into bread, he did not test God and He declared to worship God alone. Imagine yourself for forty days reflecting upon all your needs. Your need as a mother, father, grandparents, daughter, son, brother, sister, aunt, uncle, and a friend. I would imagine this could be so overwhelming. We have so many needs personally and yet there are other needs that concerns us.

For many years of doing pastoral ministry, there are times that I have put aside my own personal needs. But there is one thing that I will never set aside, the need to be inspired and renewed through the Word of God. So I invite all of you to take this time to let yourself be open as the Word of God is revealed to you - by reading the Bible, by prayer, by fasting, by praising God, by joining your faith community in missions or just allow yourself to engage in healthy and meaning conversations about your Lenten journey with others. We need a renewal of heart and mind. We need to rejuvenate ourselves as Christians. As Jesus prepared for His Galilean ministry, He needed the forty days of fasting and prayers. It was not an easy earthly ministry for Him, but it was all worth it! It was Jesus' sacrifice by which God saves humanity from sin and death.

In this Season of Lent, may you all take the time to answer God's invitation, "Return to me with your whole heart" (Joel 2:12). Come to our God inspired and renewed!

Finance Committee News

STEWARDSHIP NEWS

We have completed our annual stewardship drive for 2020. We received a total of 12 giving unit (married couples or single persons) pledges for 2020. The total pledged was \$41,892. For comparison, here is a list of the pledges for the last 5 years:

- 2016 16 pledges = \$51,260
- 2017 14 pledges = \$41,350
- 2018 16 pledges = \$40,600
- 2019 14 pledges = \$42,435
- 2020 12 pledges = \$41,892

Based on last year's records, \$11,320.00 can be expected for the coming year from persons who have established giving patterns but did not fill out cards (9 giving units).

This gives a grand total of \$53,212.00 in anticipated income for the next 12 months.

For comparison our budget for 2020 is \$98,033. Our actual expenses for 2019 were \$87,525. This indicates a budget shortfall between \$34,000 and \$45,000.

As you can see this is a significant projected shortfall. As a result, the Finance Committee is focusing on additional fund-raising activities. These activities will probably not make up that shortfall, but every little bit helps.

So, the Finance committee asks for your continued prayers as we look to provide good stewardship for our church. On the bright side, we have been on this path before as you can see from the previous year pledges. We have ultimately met our obligations and continued the mission of St. Luke's UMC and we will strive to do so again in 2020.

If you have any questions or concerns, please let me know. We will continue to update you throughout the year on our stewardship progress.


FINANCE COMMITTEE NEWS

Our fourth quarter offering was \$21,681.03 of which \$20,298.03 was unrestricted. A bar chart showing our offerings for the fourth quarter is outlined below.




The total unrestricted offering for the year was \$83,001.64. The total giving for 2019 was \$88,363.64.


St Luke's Expenses for 2019 totaled \$87,525.55. Our budget for 2019 was set at \$93,525. We were able to come in under our budget by approximately \$6,000. These expenses are broken down in the pie charts below.


